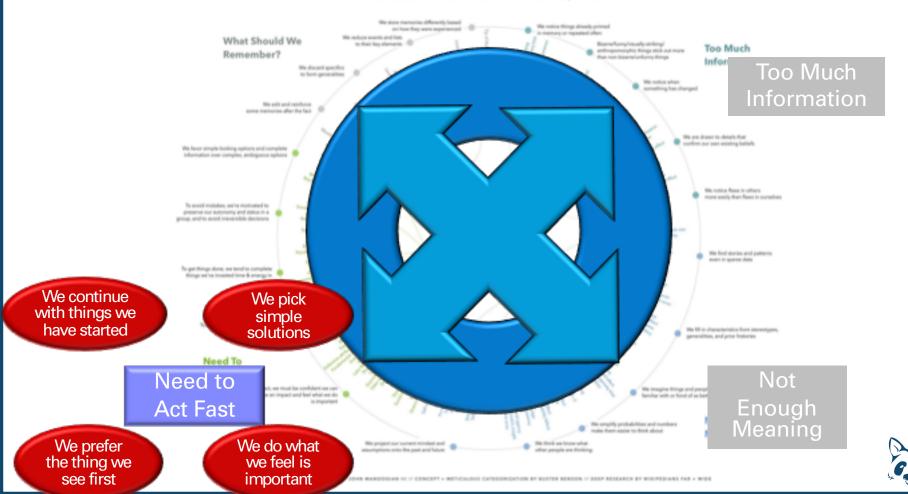


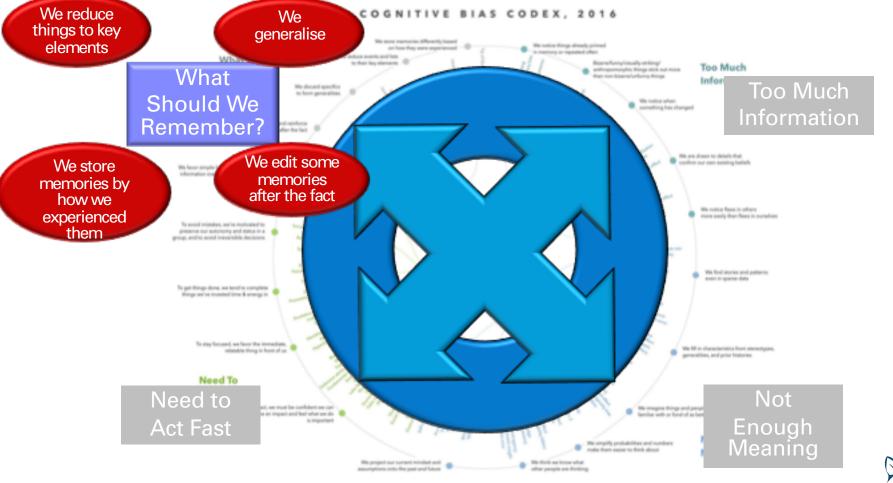














Everything that the brain sees or hears or touches has multiple interpretations. The one that is ultimately chosen is simply the brain's best guess at interpreting what flows into it.

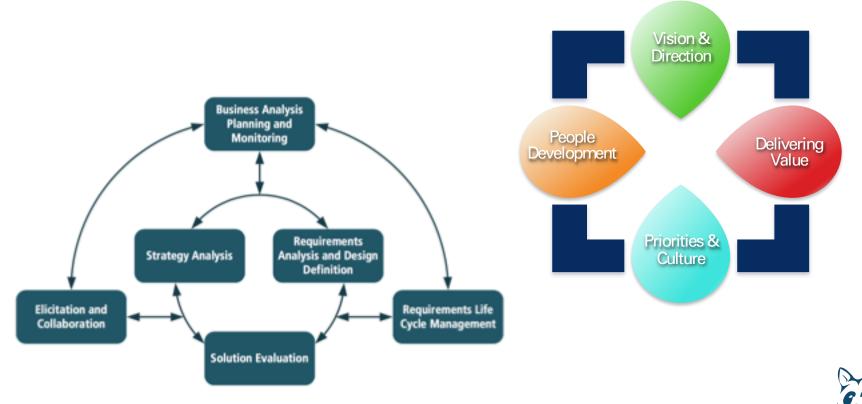

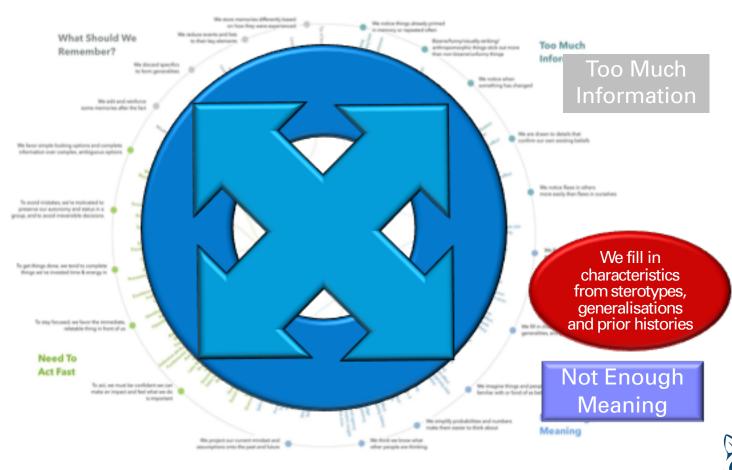

#### **Fundamental Attribution Bias**

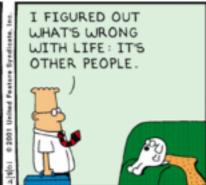
is the tendency people have to overemphasize personal characteristics and ignore situational factors in judging others' behaviour

# The bias that is the basis of many sales techniques

#### Anchoring

Anchoring is the common human tendency to rely too heavily, or "anchor," on one trait or piece of information when making decisions.

  Option 3 \$500,000

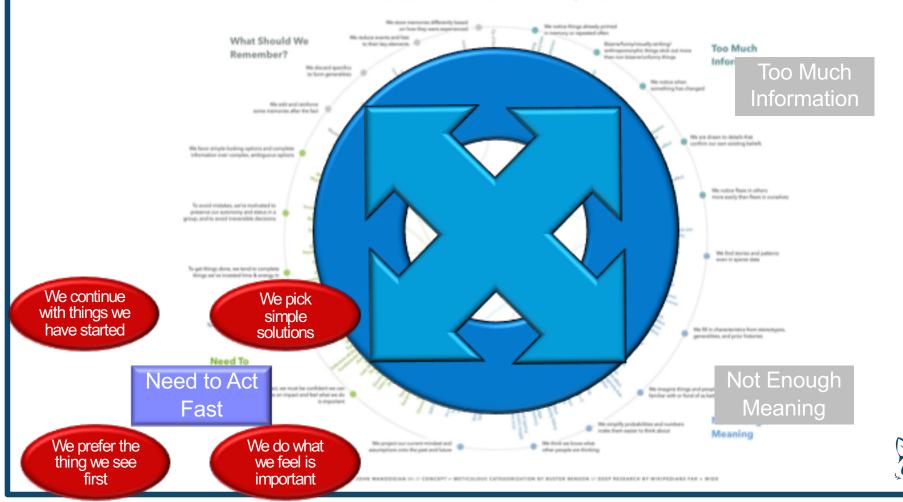
