BENEFITS? WHAT'S GOING ON?



There are several ways the US Air Force could have wasted \$1.1bn. It could have poured tomato ketchup into 250m gallons of jet fuel or bought a sizeable stake in Bear Stearns*.

Instead it upgraded its IT systems.

Bear Stearns was a global investment bank that crashed in 2008.

Context: Work began in 2007 to reconfigure how the force managed its logistics, with the aim of replacing 200 dated networks with a single piece of software. By the time the project was abandoned five years later it was at least four years behind schedule and would have required an additional \$1.1bn to become usable.

WHAT'S GOING ON 2?



From my experience, 20 per cent of projects fail, and 40-50 per cent have a cost overrun, time overrun or don't meet requirements.

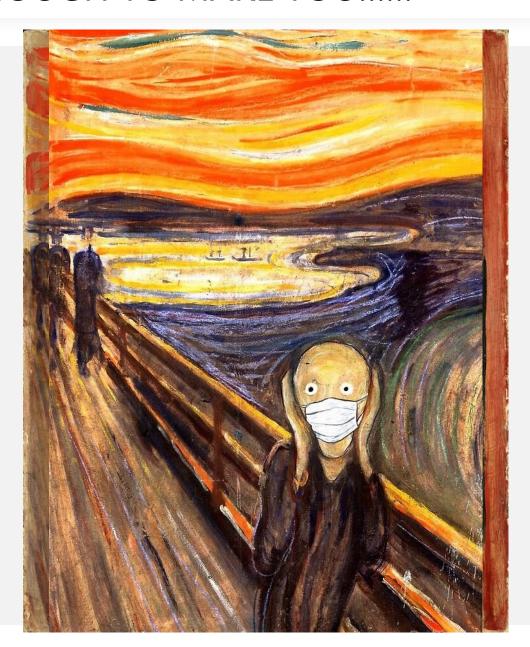

The disappointing failure rates of IS projects and the uncertainty of value realisation through systems use are still troubling practitioners and puzzling researchers Cecez-Kecmanovic et al, 2014

20 – 30% of all IS development projects are perceived as overwhelming failures, while 30% to 60% are partial failures Wright and Capps, 2011
